

2024 Year in Review

The year 2024 was a remarkable one for the institution in many ways. Alongside the new Board of Directors, we continue to move forward in a two-year journey during which we reviewed important issues, such as our focus, structure, priorities and the organizational culture we want as an institution. Some of the fruits of this process are already visible:

a) A new work structure in 8 areas, with a more institutional and transversal perspective: Services, Programs, Doctors, Quality & Processes, People, Sustainability & Finance, Image & Communication and Partnerships.

b) Our institutional approach is now grounded in three strategic pillars: 1) Focused on vulnerable patients, 2) Operating with an institutional perspective, and 3) Promoting teamwork as an ecosystem.

c) A new leadership structure in some Programs and areas within them.

d) A new structure and leadership in certain Support and Administration areas.

We believe that these changes are necessary to be better prepared for what is to come, while at the same time being aware that they will require an effort to make them a reality. We hope everyone embraces this new approach, understanding that it requires having the right heart and attitude

As we do every year, we would like to extend our heartfelt



gratitude to our donors and partners, many of whom have been supporting us for quite some time, along with interesting contributions and suggestions. These national and international companies and brands have long been going above and beyond, sometimes without receiving the recognition they deserve; we want to honor them by being grateful and transparent, reaffirming our alliance with them. We participated in the USAID Children's Eye Health Program Global Strategic Planning Workshop held in Geneva (Switzerland) on January 25th – 26th, 2024. Key findings on children's eye health were discussed and goals for the next five years were set at the event.



Fundación Visión was part of the elaboration of the PAHO/WHO Paraguay 2024-2028 Intersectoral Consultation, in line with the national health policy and goals for 2030.



We participated in the IAPB World Assembly in Mexico, where we presented several academic papers as well as our institutional work model. During the same trip, we visited the Mexican Institute of Ophthalmology (IMO) in Santiago de Querétaro, an institution that works to prevent blindness and train ophthalmologists.



The CEO of Fundación Visión, Ryan Toews, along with Dr. Valeria Sanchez (Mexico) and Frank Hida (Brazil), took the leadership of the International Agency for the Prevention of Blindness (IAPB) for the Latin American region. Similarly, Cristina Sanchez, Institutional Relations Manager of Fundación Visión, assumed the position of Regional Coordinator. This will help our organization to continue working actively in the promotion of blindness prevention activities in the region.

News



We participated in the Paraguayan Society of Ophthalmology (SPO) Conference. A total of 28 speakers gave lectures in various specialties. In addition, we had the opportunity to have a stand of the National Vision 2020 Committee Paraguay (CONAVIP) and a stand of Phaco Training Center.



In 2024 our Community Health Clinic carried out six surgical campaigns in different regions of the country, performing 452 surgeries, mainly for people from vulnerable communities. The campaigns were carried out in Santa Rosa del Aguaray, Coronel Bogado, Pilar, Villa Hayes (together with Clínica Chaco) and Campo 9.



Our staff received training from the Inclusive Development and Disabilities Program (DID) on how to interact with individuals with disabilities. Depending on each clinic's needs, training included topics like autism, Deaf culture, and sign language.



On World Transplant Day, the Eye Bank and the Comprehensive Management of Diabetes and Pre Diabetes Program (MIDIA) were present at the National Institute of Ablation and Transplantation (INAT), providing blood pressure, glycemia, body composition, and diabetes risk test services.



As part of World Sight Day, we joined the IAPB's campaign to raise awareness of the importance of vision care in society through numerous activities in our clinics, digital media and special events, among others.



All Fundación Visión programs took part in the Regional Special Olympics, which hosted over 23 delegations. More than 1,200 patients received medical care during the event.



To commemorate the month of hearing, the Ñahendu program conducted free studies and consultations in various institutions. The program reached out to the most vulnerable communities.



Our Oral Health Program reached six indigenous communities in Itá, Casanillo, Yvapovyndy, Naranjal, and Tarumandy, delivering high-quality care to these underserved areas of the country.

News



We have officially opened our new clinic in Luque, marking a significant milestone in the expansion of our services. As one of the fastest-growing cities in Paraguay, Luque presents a unique opportunity to bring quality healthcare closer to a thriving community.



We inaugurated our MIDIA Clinic, focused on the prevention and comprehensive care of diabetes and pre-diabetes. Located across from our Central Clinic, this new facility enhances our capacity to serve those affected by this condition with greater quality and reach.



As part of CONAVIP, we launched the Rapid Assessment of Avoidable Blindness (RAAB), a study conducted roughly every ten years to assess the national situation regarding blindness. This year, we focused on detailed mapping in the Central and Cordillera departments - challenging but essential work to understand the on-the-ground reality and regional needs.



We launched our new Oral Health Clinic, equipped with advanced technology and a dedicated team, to deliver high-quality dental services - particularly for low-income patients.



We received the keys and held a groundbreaking ceremony on donated land in Santa Rosa del Aguaray, future site of our Santa Rosa Clinic. Spanning 8,000 m², this land provides ample room to develop facilities tailored to the community's healthcare needs. Thanks to local donors, we have already built a guard house, which will serve as an initial base for ophthalmology consultations.



Our Inclusive Development and Disabilities Program (DID) reached 424 high school students with training on best practices and respectful treatment within educational settings, planting seeds of inclusion from an early age. Additionally, 126 employees from prominent companies received specialized training.



In 2024, the Ñahendu Program held 12 outreach days across multiple regions, delivering over 700 diagnostic studies and 250 specialized otorhinolaryngology consultations, among other services otorhinolaryngology, among other services.

Our clinics delivered 301,686 services in 2024, a historic high that reflects significant growth over previous years.



3 new spaces for Programs and Services

We established dedicated clinics for our Oral Health and Midia programs and launched an Early Diagnosis and Visual Rehabilitation Unit (Pediatrics + Low Vision) within our Central Clinic.



Historic record in social support



More than 86,000 people nationwide benefited from social support, including fully exempted services (14%) and subsidized care (86%).




Retinopathy of Prematurity (ROP): 727 screenings conducted for newborns

We celebrated the 2024 graduation of our ophthalmology specialists and subspecialists, trained to the highest standards at our teaching hospital with a strong focus on community care.



We commemorated the 20th anniversary of our Retinopathy of Prematurity (ROP) Department. During this celebration, we had the visit of authorities from the Ministry of Health and Social Welfare, directors, chiefs, doctors and licensees belonging to the 10 hospitals covered by the Department, key players in this effort. Allies, friends, donors and sponsors of this noble work were also present. We continue to work so that no more babies are blinded by ROP.



Directors of Fundación Visión and the Director of Advocacy of the International Agency for the Prevention of Blindness (IAPB), Drew Keys, met with the Minister of Health, Dr. María Teresa Barán. They discussed national advances in blindness prevention and eye care, ongoing collaboration between Fundación Visión and the Ministry of Health, and Paraguay's role in the upcoming 2026 Global Summit for Eye Health.
